**ZONE UPDATE**

The following is a report on the Flood Zone #5 activities since the last Advisory Board (AB) meeting:

**Easkoot Creek Maintenance**

The annual creek cleanup was done in October and November, 2010 including removal of cattails downstream of Calle de Arroyo. The work was performed by Conservation Corps. No dredging work was done due to the lack of sediment accumulation in the creek.

**Watershed Management Program**

The Easkoot Creek preliminary Request for Proposals (RFP) have been developed but it is not ready for circulation because the issues related to the scope of the wetland feasibility analysis and defining the influence of tidal surge is still being addressed. It is planned to present the draft RFP at a February Technical Work Group meeting.

Also, the Flood Control District (FCD) is in the process of recruiting an associate civil engineer (fixed term) for the watershed program. The new engineer is anticipated to be aboard by February 2011 and will work directly with the Stinson Beach community to scope and manage the RFP.

Additionally, FEMA is encouraging the FCD to participate in their Cooperating Technical Partners program which could provide funding to augment the existing watershed budget.
